# Richard R. Nelson Memorial Lecture

Dr. Jan Leach, University
Distinguished Professor of Plant
Pathology in the Department of
Bioagricultural Sciences and Pest
Management, Colorado State University,
presented the first annual Richard R.
Nelson Memorial Lecture, "Approaches
to Broad-spectrum, Durable Plant
Disease Resistance," on April 16, 2007.
Dr. Leach's research focuses on
understanding the molecular basis for
durable resistance.

The Richard R. Nelson Memorial Lectures were established in memory of **Dr. Richard R. Nelson** (1926–1991). Dr. Nelson joined Penn State's Plant Pathology faculty in 1966 and was named Evan Pugh Professor in 1974. He retired with Emeritus rank in 1985. This lecture was the first in an annual series that will focus on host-pathogen genetics.

#### **Also of Note**

During their spring meeting, the Pennsylvania Vegetable Growers Association formally announced that **Alan MacNab** was the recipient of their 2007 Award. The Association selected him for the award last fall and presented a certificate to Alan prior to his death in November 2006.
