2010 Richard R. Nelson Memorial Lecture

Dr. Barbara Valent, Distinguished Professor of Plant Pathology at Kansas State University, delivered the 2010 R. R. Nelson Lecture "Battle Inside a Rice Cell: Effector Dynamics During Biotrophic Invasion by the Rice Blast Fungus, Magnaporthe oryzae" on 5 April. Dr. Valent studies rice blast disease, one of the most explosive diseases threatening rice production worldwide. She led the establishment of this disease as a model for understanding the molecular and cellular mechanisms underpinning host specificity and pathogenesis.

The **Richard R. Nelson Memorial Lectures** were established in memory of Dr. Richard R. Nelson (1926-1991). The annual lectures focus on host-pathogen genetics.

"Students' Choice" Seminar Lecture





Guest Seminar Lecture
