The mission of the Center is to improve pest protection of Pennsylvania's plant resources through synergism and enhanced collaboration among the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, Penn State, Department of Conservation of Natural Resources and other state, federal and private partners. As part of this mission the Clinic was awarded funds to cover two graduate student assistantships for the summer months. Sara is currently seeking out students who may be interested in this opportunity. This commitment would require approximately 20 hours/week of work in the Plant Disease Clinic. The student's summer assistantship would be covered. There is also the possibility that the work in the Clinic could count for course credits. Welcome Dr. Kari Peter...



Kari joined the PPEM department in January, 2013 and will be at the FREC facility in Biglerville. Dr. Peter earned her bachelor's degree in entomology and plant pathology at the Univ.of Delaware and her master's degree and doctorate in plant pathology from Cornell University. From 2008 to 2010, she was a postdoctoral fellow in plant pathology here at Penn State where she researched transmission of plant viruses by aphids and the mechanisms for vector specificity. Dr. Peter comes to Penn State after two years in the Food Quality Laboratory at the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture's Agricultural Research Service in Beltsville, MD. As a research associate, she studied post-harvest fungal diseases of apples and mechanisms associated with their biocontrol. "My Master Gardener experience and the interaction I've had with growers in my previous positions will allow me to develop a holistic research and extension program that will help growers address all major fruit pathogens," per Dr. Peter.
